

## **HOW TO ACCESS THE NATIONAL CANDIDATE FORUM WEBCAST NOVEMBER 2, 2007**

The following instructions will help you access the National Candidate Forum webcast on November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2007:

1. You are not required to register for the webcast, nor do you require a username or password. **IMPORTANT:** If you visit the HOVRS website before November 2<sup>nd</sup>, you will be viewing their standard business site. HOVRS, which has generously offered to sponsor and host the webcast, is currently in the process of preparing their site to provide an excellent webcast experience. Your patience is appreciated.
  
2. The following equipment is required:
  - a. computer with sound;
  - b. web browser, such as Internet Explorer; and
  - c. high-speed Internet connection (cable, modem, T1/T3)—this is **MANDATORY**. Even if you have a high-speed connection, conditions on the Internet may affect your viewing. You cannot access the webcast with a dial-up connection.
  - d. no special software is required to view the webcast; it will open a window in your web browser.
  
3. On the day of the webcast, go to [www.hovrs.com](http://www.hovrs.com) for specific instructions on how to access the webcast.

## **NATIONAL CANDIDATE FORUM WEBCAST FREQUENTLY-ASKED QUESTIONS**

Where do I access the webcast?

**Access the webcast at [www.hovrs.com](http://www.hovrs.com)**

Do I need to register and create a password?

**No pre-registration or password is required.**

Is specific log-in information required?

**No log-in is required to view the webcast.**

Is special equipment and/or software necessary to view this webcast?

**You need a PC with sound, a web browser such as Internet Explorer, and a high-speed Internet connection (DSL, cable or T1/T3)**

What time can the webcast be viewed? How long will it run?

**The webcast begins at 9 a.m. Eastern Standard Time (EST) and will end at approximately 4:30 p.m. EST. You may start and stop your viewing as often as you wish.**

Is the webcast accessible to deaf and hard-of-hearing viewers?

**An ASL interpreter will appear on-camera with each speaker, and CART will be available on the webcast. A transcript of the event will also be available.**

Will CART transcription be available in Braille after the event?

**Braille transcription will be available.**

Can I submit questions to the candidates by e-mail during the webcast?

**Questions have been submitted by New Hampshire voters and representatives of the nation's premier disability rights, advocacy, and education organizations. The organizers believe that the questions represent a broad cross-section of Americans with disabilities.**

What if I am having technical issues?

**The webcast is designed to be as easy to access as possible, but there are many variables that can affect accessibility. Local equipment, local Internet connection, Internet traffic and technical issues at the event site can all impact the webcast's availability. If you are experiencing difficulties, check to ensure that you have the appropriate equipment and connection, then close the webcast window and reopen it.**
